

**JERMYN BOROUGH ORDINANCE**  
**GOVERNING THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE USE OF PRIVATE AND/OR**  
**ROLL-OFFS ON PAVED ROADWAYS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF JERMYN**

In order to provide for the proper management, care and control of the Borough, its roadways and its finances, as well as, to maintain the peace, good government, safety and welfare of the Borough of Jermyn and its trade, commerce and manufacturers, the Jermyn Borough Council hereby ordains and enacts as follows:

1. No party shall be permitted to use a private dumpster or roll-off on any borough paved roadway unless and until it obtains a permit from the Borough of Jermyn to do so.

2. There is imposed a Fifteen Dollar (\$15.00) fee for obtaining a permit for the use of a private dumpster or roll-off on any borough paved roadway.

3. Prior to obtaining a permit for the use of a private dumpster or roll-off on a borough paved roadway, an applicant must post a bond in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) which bond will be used to remedy any damage to borough paved roadways which may arise out of the use of the private dumpster or roll-off.

4. In utilizing a private dumpster or roll-off on borough paved roadways, parties are specifically directed to ensure that no dumpster or roll-off comes into direct contact with the actual surface of any borough paved roadway by placing a protective barrier between the private dumpster or roll-off and the actual


surface of the paved roadway.


5. Failure to abide by the provisions of this ordinance will subject the non-compliant party to a fine of not more than ~~Three Hundred (\$300.00)~~ plus costs of prosecution for each day's violation.


6. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days from the enactment herein.
